Federation Gold Cup Festival



Our Second Annual National Federation of Music Clubs Gold Cup Festival auditions will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 28, 2009 at our Chamblee location. 178 students have registered to participate in

the piano, voice, guitar, violin, and viola solo events, piano duet event and piano concerto event. The judges are Mr. David Nash, Mrs. Martha Carroll, Mrs. Julie Soh-Harbin, Mrs. Portia Hawkins, Mr. Glen Eckman and Mr. Carey Huddlestun.

Students will prepare one piece from the National Federation syllabus and one of their own choices. They will perform the pieces by memory privately for the judge and will receive comments, a certificate and points toward their gold cup trophy.

Performers should remember the following:

1. Arrive and register 15 minutes before the scheduled audition time.
2. Bring the music with measures numbered for the judge's use. According to Federation rule, students without the original music will be disqualified.
3. Dress up for the occasion.
4. Warm-up at home before you come because no warm-up room will be available.
