Spring Recitals

Our Spring Recitals will be held on Saturday, May 10 at Piano Works, Sunday, May 18 at Briarcliff Baptist Church, and Saturday, May 24 at

England Piano.

Each performer will receive a music trophy at the end of the recital. Piano Guild, ABRSM certificates, and "Most Improved Student" awards will also be presented.

These recitals are formal performances and we should observe the following rules:

Be on time. The recital will start promptly. Performers should arrive at least 15 minutes before the recital to be lined up in the order of performance. If you are late, you should notify the teacher at the door, and we can arrange for you to play later in the program.

Dress code. Participants should dress up for the occasion. Boys should wear a dress shirt with a neck tie or bow tie and long dress pants or khakis. Girls should wear a dress, or a blouse and a skirt. Blue jeans, T-shirts, shorts, sport shoes, platform shoes and mini skirts are not appropriate.

Stage etiquette. Students should practice proper stage manners, including bowing before and after the performance.

Manners. Performers need a quiet environment to concentrate and try to do their best. Interruptions like talking and going in and out of the room can bother the performer, as well as the audience members who are trying to listen.

Family and friends are invited. Camcorders and cameras are allowed. Parents, we would greatly appreciate it if you would have someone take care of your baby or toddler at home.

Tuition is still due by the 10th of each month. If you will be away, please mail the check by the 10th.

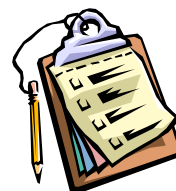


Make-Up Lessons
